25) Case study:

Statistics released by the Costa Rican Tourism Board (JCT) indicate 2.2 million tourists visited Costa Rica in 2011, a figure that represents a 4 per cent increase over 2010 numbers. The direct contribution of the travel and tourism industry to Costa Rica's GDP was 4.8 per cent in 2011. This primarily reflects the economic activity generated by industries such as hotels, travel agents, airlines and other passenger transportation services. It also includes, for example, the activities of the restaurant and leisure industries directly supported by tourists. The contribution of travel and tourism to Costa Rica's GDP is expected to grow to over 5 per cent by 2022. Similarly, travel and tourism generated 93 500 jobs directly in 2011 (4.5 per cent of total employment) and this is forecast to grow to 131 000 jobs over the next ten years. Many of the visitors are leisure tourists interested in ecotourism and they come to Costa Rica to experience the great variations in climate and altitude across the country and to see the ways in which these have had an effect on plant and animal life. The country has huge biological diversity and is home to 870 species of birds, 205 mammals, 215 reptiles and 160 amphibians, together with 130 freshwater fish and 360 000 species of insects. There are also 10 000 different types of plants. In total, the country has approximately 5 per cent of the world's total terrestrial species and is regarded as being the most biologically diverse country on the planet.
