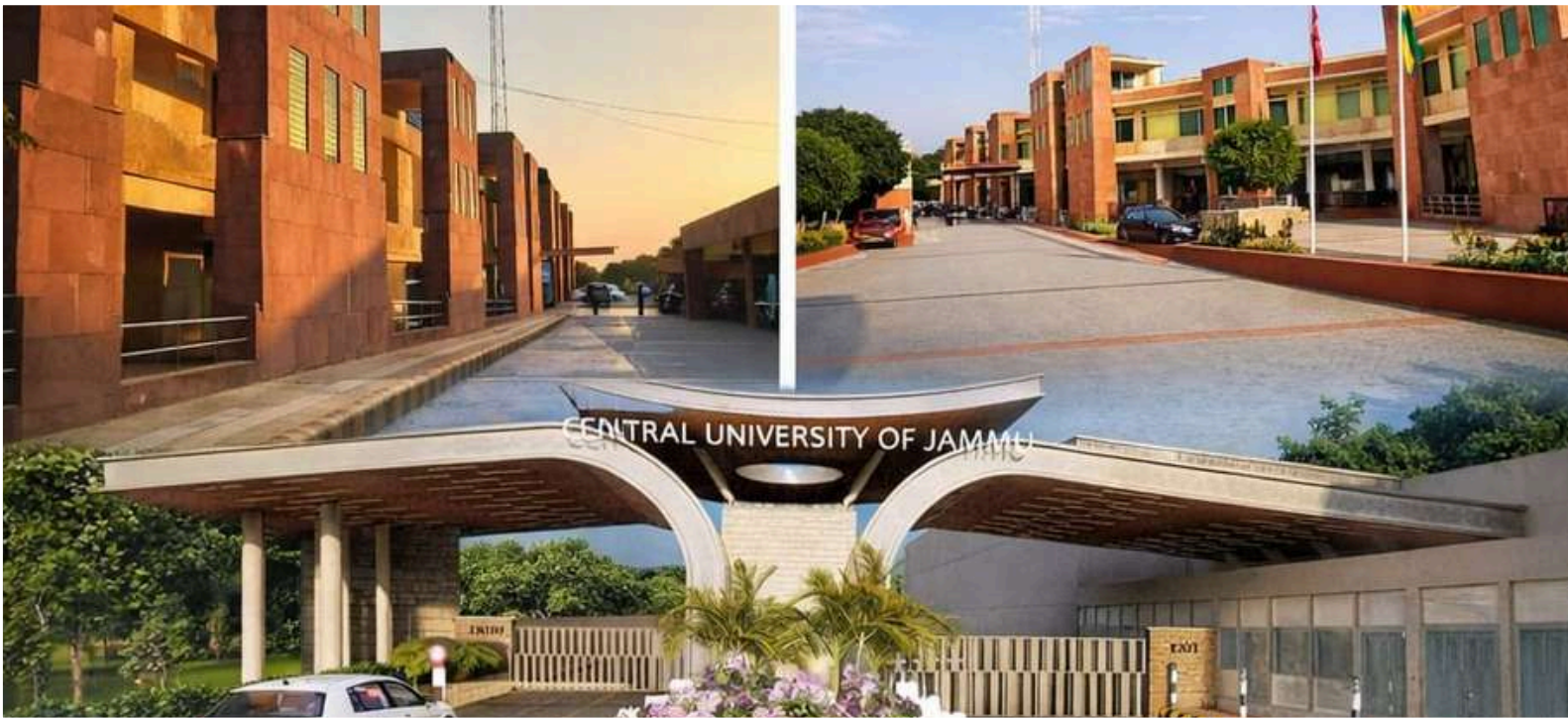

VISION



To be an advance Centre for research and systematic study of multi-religious and cultural ethos of India by adopting the comparative, interdisciplinary, scientific, dialogical critical and analytical methods. Part of the vision is to transform the society by promoting communal harmony, mutual appreciation and the spirit of the tolerance in the context of pluralism.

The mission of the Centre for Comparative Religions and Civilizations is to describe and interpret the developments, worldviews, and practices of religious traditions in a non-sectarian, academic manner, for the benefit of students, faculty from other fields, and the public. Within a public university, religion must be approached with academic objectivity and without favouritism for any one tradition. Yet, religion must also be studied with sensitivity and empathy for the millions of believers whose lives are shaped by their faith. Comparative religion examines the spiritual quest of humankind, especially as it has manifested itself in the world's living religions. These include Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism, Christianity, Islam, Sikhism, Judaism, and other less familiar traditions. No other academic field examines the origins, sacred writings, rituals, beliefs, and worldviews of various religions for their own sake, rather than as an aspect of another field of study. The Centre is to be a celebration of India's multicultural and multi-religious ethos.

The academic study of Religions was understood by nineteenth century scholars to be a 'scientific' discipline based on observation and objective analysis just as the other sciences were. A Science of Religion, based on an impartial and truly scientific comparison of all, or at all events, of the most important, Religions of mankind, is now only a question of time. It becomes the duty of those who have devoted their life to the study of the principal Religions of the world in their original documents, and who value and revere it in whatever form they may present them self, to take possession of this new territory in the name of true science. The Centre for the study of Comparative Religions and Civilizations is one of the very few institutions of its kind in this country and we, at Central University of Jammu, are proud to keep it running. The Centre was established in July, 2016. The Director In-charge of the Centre is Prof. Niranjna Bhandari. 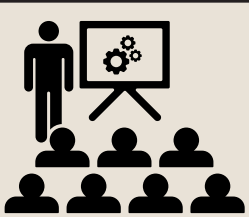
FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME-2025

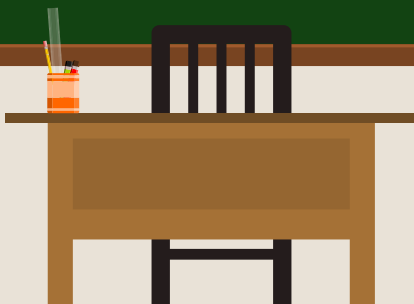
Basant Panchami Celebration

EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIP

Purmandal Temple is an ancient Shaiva shrine located about 40 km from Jammu, on the banks of the sacred Devika River. Often called “Chhota Kashi,” it is dedicated to Lord Shiva and holds strong religious and cultural importance in the Jammu region. The complex features multiple small temples, ghats, and natural springs, reflecting a long tradition of pilgrimage and ritual bathing. Architecturally modest yet spiritually significant, Purmandal is especially vibrant during Shivratri and other Shaiva festivals, drawing devotees from across Jammu and Kashmir.

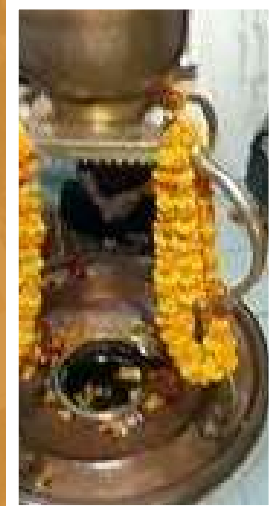


PARMANDAL



The *Nilamata Purāṇa*, an early medieval Sanskrit text describing the sacred geography and ritual traditions of the Kashmir–Jammu region, refers to Purmandal as an important Śaiva tīrtha associated with the sacred Devikā River. The text highlights the sanctity of Devikā's waters and emphasizes ritual bathing, worship of Śiva, and the performance of vows (vrata) and ancestral rites (śrāddha) at such riverine shrines.

The Centre for Comparative Religions and Civilizations conducted an educational field trip activity on 28th November 2025 to Purmandal (Chhota Kashi). The agenda of the activity was to provide first-hand information on religious architecture and the cultural significance of the Devika River. The activity consisted of faculty members, Ph.D. scholars, and M.A. students of the department. The activity was organized and executed well under the guidance of the Centre. The group visited the Inderashwer Temple and the Umapati Temple, observing the Nagara style of architecture and the cluster of 108 temples. The students were actively participated in the event by interacting with local experts like Sh. Ashutosh Sharma and Acharya Adarsh Panday at Ved Vidyalaya. The event was very informative regarding the intersection of cultural influences and the region's spiritual identity.
